UNIT 2: PATIENCE



ANCHOR: Patience means waiting for the best thing even when you don't feel like it.



ACTION POINT #1: Patience means waiting your turn.

CONVERSATION STARTERS:

1. Where was the map leading the crew?
2. Why was Diggy getting impatient with the Captain?
3. Did Diggy ever get what he was waiting for?

FAMILY ACTIVITY:

Choose a fun game to play together that involves taking turns. Make sure that everyone gets a chance to go first and that everyone takes a turn waiting.



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ACTION POINT #3: Patience means you don't give up, and you keep trying.

CONVERSATION STARTERS:

1. What made the ship stop so suddenly?
2. How did the crew try to help get the ship unstuck?
3. What did Diggy do that helped solve their problem?

FAMILY ACTIVITY:

Have children try some new tasks in the house that they don't normally do (wash dishes, vacuum, clean bathroom, etc.) Help them to do the task and encouraged them to keep trying even if it's hard at first.



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ACTION POINT #2: Patience means not complaining or whining while you endure a tough situation.

CONVERSATION STARTERS:

1. What was causing the mess on the boat?
2. What did Diggy and Piper have to do in the laundry room?
3. Why was Diggy getting so impatient?

FAMILY ACTIVITY:

Anytime someone in the family is whining or complaining, stop and do a silly "no whining" dance together. Remind everyone to show patience.



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ACTION POINT #4: Patience means sometimes you have to wait for the best.

CONVERSATION STARTERS:

1. What did Diggy and Piper see through the telescope that was yellow as they approached Floating Island?
2. What almost happened to the ship as they got closer?
3. What was their exciting discovery when they got to shore?

FAMILY ACTIVITY:

Plan a fun activity for the weekend, but everyone must work complete a goal during the week to be part of the activity (ex: completing daily chores). Each day, discuss how it might be tough to wait, but it's a way to demonstrate patience.
